Dr. Suprateek Sarker

Editor-in-chief, *Journal of the AIS*

Dr. Suprateek Sarker is currently the professor of information technology at the McIntire school of commerce, University of Virginia. He is also the visiting professor at Royal Holloway, University of London, UK, and a visiting distinguished professor at Aalto University, Helsinki, Finland. He received his Ph.D. from University of Cincinnati, USA. Professor Sarker has an area of expertise on qualitative research, theory development, mixed-method research, systems development, distributed work, IT-enabled organizational change, and has been published in well-regarded journals including *MIS Quarterly*; *Information Systems Research*; *Journal of Management Information Systems*; *Journal of the Association of Information Systems*; *Decision Sciences*; *IEEE Transactions on Engineering Management*; *European Journal of Information Systems*; *Decision Support Systems*, *Information Systems Journal*; *Journal of Strategic Information Systems*; *Journal of Information Technology*; *Information Technology & People*; *MIS Quarterly Executive*; *Communications of the AIS*; *Communications of the ACM*; and *Journal of the Academy of Marketing Science*. He serves as a senior editor emeritus for *MIS Quarterly*, and as an editorial board member of the *Journal of MIS*, *IEEE Transactions on Engineering Management*, and special issue co-editor for the *European Journal of Information Systems*.

Dr. Binshan Lin is the BellSouth Professor at Louisiana State University in Shreveport. He received his Ph.D. from the Louisiana State University in 1988. Dr. Hsing Kenneth Cheng is the John B. Prior to joining UF, he served on the faculty at The College of William and Mary from 1992 to 1998. He received his Ph.D. in computers and information systems from William E. Simon Graduate School of Business Administration, University of Rochester in 1992. Professor Cheng teaches information technology strategy, object-oriented analysis and design, managerial statistics, electronic commerce, and supply chain management. He was awarded the Warrington College of Business Administration Teacher of the Year for 2000-2001, and Outstanding Faculty Award, for service and teaching excellence to Professional MBA Class of 2012, of Warrington College of Business Administration, University of Florida.
